Produced by the Department of Health and Human Services, this teaching resource has many teaching activities with flexible delivery options. It's designed to assist teachers to educate young people about the risks and potential problems associated with gambling. It helps students to make informed choices and identify warning signs of problem gambling in themselves and others.

The kit examines odds, beliefs and superstitions about gambling, the pathways to problem gambling and the help available, the role of advertising in influencing gambling choices, and the interests of the different stakeholders in the gambling sector.
